Building Works:

Work is progressing on the new build with the roof now in place. Windows, plumbing, electrics, painting and flooring will take place over the coming months in time for the new school year. An electrical upgrade has taken place in the old building and new ceiling tiles in all corridors have been installed. Scaffolding is in place for the roof replacement of the old building. The staff room will also be extended. The car park will be extended in front of the new build. A new entrance is planned where the new build joins the old building.
